Welcome to The National Theatre Melbourne and to CLOC Musical Theatre's production of Chess The Musical.

What do you get if you lock the lyricist who wrote Jesus Christ Superstar and The Lion King in a room with half of ABBA? Tonight you find out.

What do you get if you lock the creative brilliance of Shaun Kingma, the musical talent of Tyson Legg and the choreographic skills of Tamara Finch in a room with *Chess*? Tonight you find that out too.

For those who have not seen Chess before, you are in for a treat - an intriguing story and wonderful music. Songs you will recognise and others that you will wish you hadn't waited this long to hear for the first time. For those who have seen it before, you too are in for a treat - a re-imagining of this fantastic show, true to all of its best aspects but with an edge and a spin that you will truly marvel at.

I first experienced *Chess* in 1995 as a performer in Shepparton. I loved being part of a cast for this fantastic show but, more importantly, kissed my wife who was also in the show for the very first time (because the director made me). For my family, the rest is history - and the director was the best man at the wedding!

As you can imagine, this show is very close to my heart and this production has only caused that love to grow.

Our amazing cast has taken on a gruelling rehearsal schedule to

create a show that far exceeds what I could have imagined. Our set builders, costume creators and all of the other CLOC volunteers who contribute to what we do, have likewise gone above and beyond to produce the sets and costumes you will see tonight that truly complete the picture. The people you are watching tonight and those behind the scenes are all volunteers and what they give to create our shows is truly amazing.

Chess focuses on the Cold War and the tensions between the then USSR (now Russia) and USA which stretched from 1947 through to the start of the 1990s. For some this is history; for others, it is a memory of a time of real fear - a finger over



a button threatening nuclear war. Set in the late 1970s, Chess exemplifies the politics of the era and the use of any opportunity for the 'East' and the 'West' to have a fight without actually taking up arms.

Had you asked me a couple of years ago, I would have questioned whether *Chess* was becoming dated and losing its relevance. Sadly, since 24 February 2022, and the full invasion of Ukraine, it has become as relevant as ever.

Thank you for joining us, thank you for your support and enjoy the show.

DIRECTOR'S NOTE

Chess has a fascinating and storied past. Banking on the earlier success of highly successful concept albums such as JC Superstar and Evita, Chess was also developed as a concept album first, with the stage production to follow. The album, released in 1984, was a huge hit. How could it not be? With an eclectic, operatic, rock/ pop infused score by Benny Anderson and Björn Ulvaeus of ABBA fame, along with lyrics and book by Tim Rice, the album received rave reviews, top marks in the charts, and several awards.

The first production of Chess opened two years later in the West End with a much-expanded book, and more music. While the music received raves, the book and story continued to be problematic. The Broadway production followed with a completely re-written book and even less favorable reviews, also focused on the book. Countless productions since have attempted (some successful, some less so), to rewrite, refocus, merge, cut and add to the story and music, leaving in its wake, a confusion of what was originally intended - a grand and epic scale political

commentary, told from an intimate and human perspective.

The production and book you are about to see most closely resembles the original book of the London production. While some of the machinations and wheeling and dealing may leave some scratching their heads, it is still a very personal story that centres around Florence. And while our story is still based in the Cold War Times, a modern approach can show us those times are far from over. World events over the past two vears have proven that history has a way of repeating itself sometimes with the very same players.

Chess is many things. It is an epic musical devised in the times of the "mega-musicals" (Cats, Phantom, Les Misérables). It is a grand opera, a high-tech pop/ rock show, an intimate love story and a personal journey of discovery. It is deliberately eclectic in its nature, sound and feel. Possibly one of the more challenging (yet thoroughly rewarding) shows I have had the privilege to work on, it is also easy to see why Chess is performed mostly in concert these days.


This production is supported by an outstanding cast of 40 singers, actors and dancers along with an orchestra of 18 musicians, all giving their time, talent, and energy. This is a notoriously challenging score, and I am in constant awe of each of them.

I would also like to thank the incredible talents of the CLOC team and committee, who have not baulked at the challenges thrown at them. Be it cast or orchestra size, LED flooring, live cameras, multimedia, LED screens, mammoth set pieces, to human sized teddy bears, the CLOC team has delivered. DIRECTION & DESIGN

SHAUN KINGMA Director/Set Designer

Shaun is one of the most well-known, prolific, and awarded talents in the Melbourne music theatre scene, as director, performer, and designer. Shaun studied Classical Voice at the Victorian College of the Arts and has been heavily involved in the performing arts for over 30 years, receiving numerous awards and nominations for his direction, set design and performance credits.

As a director, Shaun's recent credits include: Meeka (45 Downstairs), Long Gone Lonesome Cowgirls (Ellis Productions), Frankenstein, Next to Normal (WMTC), Singin' in The Rain (CentreStage), La Cage Aux Folles (Quirky Productions), The Hatpin, (OzmadeMusicals-Magnormos), Tomorrow Morning, Aida (Whitehorse), Return To The Forbidden Planet, Is There Some of his performing Life After High School?, A Funny Thing Happened on the Way to the Forum (FabNobs), the Australian premiere of Hello Again and David Lindsay Abaire's A Devil Inside.

Set design credits include: Chicago (PLOS), Jekyll & Hyde (CLOC-additional design), Jesus Christ Superstar (CLOC), La Cage Aux Folles (Quirky Productions), (Floyd-Guild nomination), Frankenstein, Next to Normal (WMT) and The Wedding Singer (Robbie Singin' in The Rain (CentreStage).

For CLOC, Shaun has performed in A Chorus Line (Zack), Les Misérables (Javert), Jekyll & Hyde (Utterson), The Scarlet Pimpernel (Chauvelin) and directed our productions of Blood Brothers, Man of La Mancha, and Aspects of Love. He both directed and set designed our 2016 production of Jesus Christ Superstar, which won eight CLOC shows, all directed Music Theatre Guild awards, including Production of the Year, followed up by the same double duty for Jekyll & Hyde Christ Superstar (2016-Guild in 2018.



Tyson is another multitalented theatre performer who is equally at home under lights on a stage or with a baton in hand fronting an orchestra, or even as director. He has received multiple Green Room, Music Theatre Guild and Lyrebird nominations and commendations for both performance and musical direction.

And as a director, his shows have included Assassins and Rent.

Tyson has previously musically directed three by Shaun Kingma - Man of La Mancha (2010), Jesus nomination) and Jekyll & Hyde (2018-Guild nomination).



Choreographer

In a period spanning over 45 years, Tamara has had extensive experience as a freelance dance teacher. With a list of credits both vast and varied, she has worked with many of Melbourne's theatre companies as a producer, choreographer and director.

Tamara has received many Victorian Music Theatre Guild nominations over the years; in 2023 she was awarded the choreography Guild for her production of Chicago and in 1996 for her production of Hair. For CLOC, Tamara has previously choreographed Chicago (2001- Guild award), Cats (2006-Guild nomination), and again working with Shaun, Blood Brothers (2007), Man of La Mancha (2010), Aspects of Love (2011), Jesus Christ Superstar (2016-Guild nomination) and Jekyll & Hyde (2018-Guild nomination). She also directed and choreographed CLOC's acclaimed production of Pippin (2003), which won five Music Theatre awards, including both Direction and Choreography for Tamara,

as well as Production of the Year.



Having trained at the Australian College of Entertainers, Sallyanne joins the production team with an extensive background in the performing arts. Sallyanne's onstage credits include Sweeney Todd, All My Sons (Sue Bayliss), Gypsy (Mazeppa), Fiddler on the Roof (Yente), Anything Goes (Evangeline Harcourt), Oklahoma! (Aunt Eller), Seussical (Mrs Mayor), Oliver! Both her spectacular designs for 2022 -Jersey Boys and Chicago - received nominations. Her most recent CLOC show was Catch Me if You Can, whose chic 1960s creations drew much admiration and plaudits from our audiences.

As well as her CLOC commitments for 2023, Vicky designed the costumes earlier this year for the musical premiere of Not Finished With You Yet starring Christie Whelan Browne and Rohan Browne.





SYNOPSIS act 1

The president of the International Chess Federation—The Arbiter—explains the origins of chess and announces the location of the upcoming world chess championship: Merano, Italy. As the town prepares for the occasion, the current world champion, Freddie Trumper of the United States, arrives with his second and lover, Hungarian-born, English-raised Florence Vassy.

Florence confronts Freddie about his brash behaviour and rocky relationship with the press, which immediately gets out of hand when he assaults a journalist at a press conference. Meanwhile, Freddie's Soviet Russian challenger, Anatoly Sergievsky, argues with his own second, the scheming Molokov.

The chess opening ceremony commences with the American and Soviet delegates each vowing their side will win, the Arbiter insisting on a clean game, and marketers looking to make a profit. During the increasingly intense match, Freddie storms out of the arena, leaving Florence to negotiate with Anatoly, Molokov and The Arbiter.

Florence arranges a meeting between the two champions, after trading heated words with Molokov. She learns that Freddie had engineered the outburst in the hope of extracting more money from his sponsor, an American sensationalist media company, Global Television. Walter, Global Television's representative in Freddie's delegation, criticizes the stunt as ludicrous.

Florence confronts Freddie, and they fight about the politics of the tournament where he viciously turns the argument towards her missing father, believed captured or killed by Soviet forces during the 1956 Hungarian Revolution. Florence storms from their hotel room to the reconciliatory meeting she has scheduled between Freddie and Anatoly at the Merano Mountain Inn. Freddie does not show for the meeting, leaving Anatoly and Florence awkwardly alone together. In the cold evening mountain air, they find common ground with each other. As romantic feelings arise, Freddie appears, witnessing Florence in an embrace with his opponent. Freddie announces bitterly that he has negotiated new financial terms with Global TV and the match can continue.


ACT 2

One year later, Anatoly is set to defend his championship in Bangkok, Thailand. Freddie is already there as Global TV's official commentator for the tournament, experiencing the Bangkok nightlife. Florence and Anatoly worry about Freddie's sudden reappearance as well as the impending arrival of Anatoly's estranged

wife, Svetlana, from Russia. Anatoly suspects Svetlana's arrival is part of Molokov's plan to shame him into returning to the Soviet Union. Molokov, meanwhile, has trained a new protégé, Viigand, to defeat and humiliate Anatoly.

Walter manipulates Freddie into embarrassing Anatoly on live television during a heated interview between them. Molokov blackmails Svetlana into urging Anatoly to throw the match. Walter, who has been promised the release of captured American agents if he can ruin Anatoly's performance, informs Florence that her father is alive though imprisoned, and that he will be released if she can convince Anatoly to lose. Despite Molokov and Walter's efforts, none of their ploys work to get Anatoly to throw the game. Molokov and Walter then team up to get Freddie to pressure Anatoly and Florence, knowing that Freddie wants to win back the love of Florence. Freddie's attempts also fail, leaving him alone yet again.

Svetlana and Florence find common ground over their respective relationships with Anatoly. Anatoly follows an anonymous letter guiding him to a temple, where Freddie appears to tell him that he is willing to put their conflict behind him and informs Anatoly of a significant flaw in Viigand's strategy that will help Anatoly win.





Chess has had a long, tortuous and chequered (pun intended) history. It was the brainchild of lyricist Sir Tim Rice, who had previously worked with Sir Andrew Lloyd Weber on three wildly successful musicals - Joseph and the Amazing Technicolour Dreamcoat, Jesus Christ Superstar and Evita. Following on from his ongoing interest in turning historical events into musical theatre, Rice had long wanted to write a musical about the Cold War and hit upon the idea of using chess rivalry as the prism through which this could take place. When Rice went to Lloyd Weber with this idea, Weber was busy working on his next musical Cats, so it was suggested by a producer that Rice work with the ABBA boys instead, which Rice happily agreed to do, as he was a big fan of ABBA and what he felt was the theatrical style of ABBA songs.

The three men worked on the musical throughout 1982 and 1983. As they had done with Jesus Christ Superstar and Evita, it was decided to release the music as a concept album before any stage productions were undertaken. This album featured a mix of West End and Swedish music performers. Released in 1984, the album was an international smash hit, winning several awards and producing stand-alone hits including One Night in Bangkok, I Know Him So Well and Nobody's Side.

The first staged production of *Chess* was in 1986 in London's West End. It was supposed to have been directed by Michael Bennett (creator of *A Chorus Line*), who had to withdraw due to ill-health (and who died in 1987 from AIDS). Trevor Nunn, who had directed the musicals *Cats* and *Les Misérables*, took over, using many of the cast from the album. This version expanded the storyline and added some exposition and dialogue. It was very successful, running for three years, and winning three Olivier awards (Best Musical, Actor and Actress).

After the West End production, the creative team decided to reimagine the show from the top down, leading to a second major stage version of the musical intended for American audiences, with considerable differences from the British version in both plot and music. The story changed drastically, with different settings, characters, many different plot elements, a re-ordered score, much more spoken dialogue, and a new set, although the basic plot remained the same. The show opened in April 1988 and although generally panned by critics, it still maintained a healthy box-office

advance. Nevertheless the Broadway production did not manage to sustain a consistently large audience and closed after 17 previews and 68 regular performances. Subsequently, many attempts were made to fix the Broadway version's perceived problems, and its failure caused Tim Rice to become disillusioned with theatre and move on to work primarily with Disney in movies.

There have since been countless re-writes and various productions of the show done worldwide, both in concert and full theatrical versions. The 1990s saw productions mounted across America and the UK, in Sweden and in Australia, where a 1990 production opened in Sydney with a new version of the book rewritten primarily by Rice to streamline the plot, using parts from each of the previous versions, as well as his original concept for the American version. It starred Jodie Gillies, John Wood and Maria Mercedes. A later Australian production played at Melbourne's Princess Theatre in 1997, featuring Barbara Dickson, Daryl Braithwaite and Delia Hannah.

In the 2000s, there have been many attempts to re-write and re-stage the definitive version of the show - Denmark, Sweden, Italy, Hungary, New Zealand, South Korea, Japan, USA and even Russia in 2020 (amazingly, in the midst of a pandemic). Most notably, in 2008, there was a concert version produced at the Royal Albert Hall in London, with almost no dialogue or set, but otherwise following the British version in plot and music. Tim Rice stated in the concert's programme that this version of *Chess* is the "official version", after years of different plot and song combinations. The cast included Adam Pascal as Freddie, Idina Menzel as Florence, Josh Groban as Anatoly and Kerry Ellis as Svetlana. This version was recorded and is available to watch on YouTube.

Australia has had its shares of productions too, including an acclaimed concert version staged by The Production Company in Melbourne in 2012 (starring Sylvie Paladino, Simon Gleeson, Martin Crewes and Bobby Fox) and a semistaged concert hall production in 2021 which toured Australia, featuring Natalie Bassingthwaighte, Paulini, Rob Mills and Alexander Lewis. CLOC also mounted a production in October 1997 (exactly 26 years ago), and remarkably, several CLOC stalwarts have been involved in both the 1997 and 2023 versions.

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
